ANTI- TAX PROTEST UPDATE

12th, July 2024

In recent weeks, Kenya has witnessed significant social and political developments spurred by the Anti-tax protests, initiated primarily by the country's youth, particularly Generation Z. These protests have catalyzed a series of events involving government responses, youth activism, and leadership changes, marking a pivotal period in Kenya's contemporary political landscape. The following points outline the sequence of key events that have unfolded this week:

- Friday, July 5th President engages with Gen Z on X platform to discuss their concerns.
- **Sunday, July 7th** Memorial Concert at Uhuru Park to honor protesters killed during the Anti-tax protest.
- Tuesday, July 9th President assents to the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission (IEBC) Amendment Bill, 2024 at KICC.
- Thursday, July 11th President dismisses almost his entire cabinet.
- Friday, July 12th Inspector General of Police resigns.

Normalcy has been <u>observed</u> in major towns and cities across the country following three weeks of anti-tax protests. The capital, Nairobi, saw a return to business as usual with most establishments operational this week. The President on Tuesday <u>announced</u> a six-day multi-sectoral dialogue forum beginning Monday, July 15, to discuss issues pressing Kenyans. The forum comes in the wake of the nationwide protests against taxation.

Total incidents recorded this week compared to 240 incidents recorded last week.

OVERVIEW

<u>Digital fraud</u> schemes are on the rise in the country with 80 per cent of Kenyan having been targeted in the first three months of year, a new TransUnion's Consumer Pulse Survey has shown. From the findings a notable 72 per cent of respondents who reported being targeted by digital fraud schemes successfully avoided falling victim.

The Government has <u>adopted</u> a new comprehensive national strategy against violent extremism and terrorism. Through the National Counter Terrorism Centre (NCTC), the government is reviewing the national strategy in order to address new and emerging trends in the digital space and the changing population demographics.

TRENDS

Crime Trends Nairobi

Crime statistics in Nairobi this week show a significant reduction, potentially due to the reduction in the arrests. Additionally, there were no abductions or kidnapping recorded compared to what was witnessed in the last week of June. This week, a total of 52 incidents were reported compared to last week's 67, with protests/riots, arrests, homicides and armed robberies being the most prevalent.



PROTESTS/RIOTS

Incidences of protests and riots continued to climb steadily this week, with 21 cases recorded compared to nine (9) during the last week. Anti-tax protests continued to agitate for justice for those killed by the police,



Arrests were among most prevalent in Nairobi this week. A few individuals were arrested as police clashed with protesters during antitax demos. Others were arrested for committing homicides, thefts and physical assault offenses.



HOMICIDE


Seven (7) homicide cases were recorded in Nairobi this week. This rate is high hence the need of authorities to address the root cause. The homicide incidents tend to be concentrated in Starehe constituency that already has substantial crime problems.

PROTESTS/RIOTS

The number of protests around the country increased slightly this week, with 59 protests/riots incidents reported compared to 49 last week. Hundreds continued protest to demand justice for those shot by the police.

There were 33 homicides recorded this week (18 more offences from last week). Compared with most other crimes, the homicide rate remains high, with around half of all homicide cases reported resulted from quarrel, a revenge attack or a loss of temper. As in the previous weeks, the most common method of killing, for victims, was by a instrument (including knives and crude weapons).

- Security Review and Enhancement: Evaluate your existing security measures. Consider increased security personnel, securing windows and valuables, and ensuring security cameras are operational.
- Business Continuity Planning: Develop a business continuity plan outlining steps to minimize disruptions, protect assets, and ensure a swift resumption of operations.
- Cybersecurity Awareness Training: Educate employees on cyber threats associated with social uprisings. This includes identifying phishing attempts and protecting sensitive information online.
